

7 - Sheep, goats and swine must be on the fairgrounds and available for check-in by 10:00 a.m. Friday, August 16, 2024. Release time for sheep, goats and swine will be at the conclusion of their show. The rabbits will check in at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, August 17, 2024. Beef must be on the fairgrounds by 11:00 Saturday, August 17, 2024 and released after the show on Sunday, August 18, 2024. Beef cattle shown in the regional show will also have the oppor-

Beef cattle shown in the regional show will also have the opportunity to show in the "Kim Shoen Classic" steer and heifer show on Saturday. Beef check-in will be from 8-11:00 on Saturday, August 17th.

8 - It will be mandatory to use wood shavings for the beef cattle bedding. Wood shavings are available at the fairgrounds at a cost of

\$10.00 per head. Tie-outs are available at no cost.

9 - Any artificial means of removing or remedying physical defects of conformation in animal's exhibits will be considered fraud and deception. Hair or hair-like substances can not be added or the hair color changed on an animal. These items will be grounds for disqualification and forfeiture of all premiums/awards.

DIVISION 1E — Rabbits

Rabbit entries must be made online using the Showman App and must be submitted no later than August 12 at 4:00 pm. No late entries or changes will be permitted after the entry deadline. Ownership affidavit, lease agreement, or copy of 4-H online registration by the ownership deadline of May 15 or the date according to your state's current 4-H ownership rules MUST be presented at the time of check-in. Single fryers and meat pens: the doe(s) producing the fryers or meat pen must have been owned by the member since May 15. Check in will be Saturday, Aug. 17th, 8:30 a.m.-10:00 a.m. only.

Each rabbit must be clearly and permanently tattooed in the left ear for identification purposes PRIOR to check-in. Tattoo definition: must show ink below the skin and must be readable. NO PERMANENT MARKER OR INK IS ACCEPTABLE. Rabbits that do not meet ID requirements will not be eligible for Supreme or Reserve awards.

Park at North Livestock Gate where assistance with transport to Bank

Midwest Building will be provided.

Check in will begin at 8:30 am on Saturday, August 17 in the Bank Midwest Building on the Martin County Fairgrounds. The show will begin at 12 (Noon.)

The rabbit entry fee will be \$2.50 per rabbit. Check-in will be accepted until 10:00 a.m. on August 17. All fees will be paid back as class money on a pro-rate basis based on the number of entries in each class, as well as premiums for the Supreme and Reserve Supreme Champion rabbits.

Supreme Champion - \$150; Reserve Champion - \$75.

Maximum of 2 single Fryers and 2 Meat pens may be shown in addition to 12 maximum breed entries, not to exceed twelve rabbits per exhibitor. All rabbits must be tattooed permanently and legibly in the left ear prior to the fair. Rabbits must be owned and identified by May 15 or by your state's current 4-H ownership rules. A copy of your affidavit of ownership or lease agreement must be included with entry form. All breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association are eligible. Rabbits will be judged according to ARBA standards. Show committee reserves the right to combine breeds with less than 5 entries. All entry fees are final and non-refundable. Animals found to be unhealthy will be removed from the arena. All rabbits must be permanently tattooed in the left ear.

No lot numbers will be associated with Single Fryers and Meat Pens. Does that produced Single Fryers and Meat Pens must have been owned by May 15 and shown on your affidavit or by date required by your state 4-H rules, also shown on an affidavit or ID form. - 6. 4-H Horse Show 8:30 a.m. Friday.
- 7. FEES \$12.00 Jackpot, \$3.00 per entry or \$6.00 pairs Saturday & Sunday Shows
- 8. FFA Class fees \$2.00 per entry
- 9. FFA & Open Class Horse Show 8:30 a.m. Saturday.
- 10. Society Horse Show 8:30 Sunday
- 11. All Horses released 6:00 p.m. Sunday. Stalls **MUST** be cleaned before leaving the fair. Leaving early or dirty stalls may result in forfeit of premiums.

- 12. Open Class & FFA Horses Stall Fee \$6.00 per stall.

Sunday Ranch Riding Classes: Junior & Senior Ranch Pleasure and Junior & Senior Ranch Ridging

Horses may not be shown in this class wih fake tails, banded or cropped manes, hoof black. Tack & Clothing should be void of silver and adornment, long sleeved collared shirt, jeans, western hat or helmet and boots. Chaps and spurs optional.

ABOUT THE RANCH HORSE RIDING CLASS: AQHA Introduced Ranch Riding classes with the purpose of the class to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasurable ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse in this class should reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working ranch horse, simulating riding typically conducted outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, released, quiet, soft, and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without requiring undue restraint, but not shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manner and responsiveness of the ranch riding horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as quality of the movement are of primary considerations. The ideal ranch riding hour should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver.

ABOUT THE RANCH HORSE PLEASURE CLASS: Ranch Horse Pleasure is judged as a rail class that is designed to show the athletic ability of the ranch type horse without having the suitable footing for reining. Judging will be based on the walk, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope, spin left or right, side pass, stop and back at the digression of the judge. Credit should be given to smoothness finesse, attitude, quickness, and authority in performing the maneuvers when asked. Ranch pleasure horses will be judged on a forward movement and carry a natural head carriage.
