Livestock Gate: Livestock Exhibitors Vehicle Pass Only must be purchased for \$20.00 in the Fair Office during the fair only. Pass must be attached to rear view mirror to drive vehicle onto the grounds. Must have regular pass or ticket for driver and passengers.

Deliveries: <u>ALL</u> deliveries must be made <u>before</u> 11:00 a.m. No vehicles will be allowed on grounds between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m.

*All service animals are welcome, however, no companion pets please.

All Martin County 4-H and FFA members will purchase a wristband for \$1.00 at the 4-H Office, on Monday August 12, 2 p.m. - 7 p.m. Members under 9 will receive a free wristband. Exhibit buildings open Tuesday, 11:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.; Wednesday through Friday, 12:00 noon to 9:00 p.m.; Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; Sunday, 12:00 noon to 6:00 p.m. All open class livestock must be registered with the Office on or before Monday, August 11, 2025.

Out-of-County Open Class livestock exhibits will be accepted after August 11, 2025 in the order received until available space is filled. Exhibit superintendents reserve the right to terminate entries when all exhibit space is filled.

Livestock will be released at the time stated under the division listings.

The 2025 Martin County Fair is a non-terminal show for all swine.

The Grandstand will be open one hour before the start of each scheduled program.

There will be ample auto parking space available free in the North Parking Lot. The area will be patrolled, however please lock your vehicle as the Martin County Fair cannot be liable for loss or damages. All errors in premium awards or checks must be reported to the fair office by the Monday after the fair. Enclose entry slips, checks, etc.





SUMMARY OF STATE RULES
EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK IN MINNESOTA
2025 REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition. All animals imported into Minnesota for exhibition must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and satisfy Board of Animal Health importation requirements.

CATTLE

Cattle must be officially identified.

SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats must be identified with official identification approved for use in the scrapie eradication program. No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth will be allowed on the fairgrounds. Any evidence of club lamb fungus, ringworm, abscesses, foot rot, sore mouth or any other contagious disease will eliminate the animal from the show.

SWINE

Swine must be individually identified and must be vaccinated for Erysipelas and swine flu with two doses 21 days apart with the last dose administered at least 21 days before the start of the fair. It is important to note that there is a significant risk associated with bringing home swine from an exhibition or show in which they were exposed to swine from numerous farms and potentially have contracted diseases from those swine. Under most circumstances it is best that these pigs all go to slaughter rather than be returned home. It is strongly recommended that any swine taken home be isolated at least 250 yards from other swine and quarantined for at least 30 days. If you are considering bringing swine back home consult with your veterinarian immediately to develop a plan on how to best manage this risk.

HORSES

All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

POULTRY

Poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band and accompanied by a form approved by the board to show compliance with one of the following: negative test for pullorum-typhoid disease conducted within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; orginate directly from parent stock tested and found negative for pullorum-typhoid disease within the last 12 months. In addition, turkeys must be tested negative or originate directly from parent stock that is tested negative for Salmonella typhimurium, Mycoplasma gallisopticum, and Mycoplasma synoviae.

DOGS

Dogs over four months of age must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian.

IMPORTED ANIMALS

All imported animals must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and meet the Board's importation requirements.

REQUIREMENT FOR LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING FROM STATES OTHER THAN MINNESOTA

CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, GOATS AND POULTRY originating from states other than Minnesota must meet the Minnesota importation requirements in addition to the requirements outlined in this summary. Individual health certificates are required on all out-of-state cattle, swine, goats and sheep. Health certificates must list the Minnesota Exhibition as consignee, and will be accepted if examination and tests are conducted within 30 days prior to the exhibition.

Cattle from Class A states (Missouri, Texas, New Mexico and Wyoming) must be official calf-hood vaccinates, originate from a certified Brucellosis free herd or be tested brucellosis negative within 60 days of exhibition.

Tuberculosis - cattle from Texas, California and New Mexico must be TB tested within 60 days of entry to be accepted. Rumirants originating from Michigan may not be imported into Minnesota for exhibition.

HORSES AND DOGS

Requirements are the same as for those originating from Minnesota.

LOCAL FAIR BOARD OPTIONS

The exhibition management may adopt more but not less restrictive health requirements than required by state rule.

- 1. The rules and/or regulations set forth herein are designed to provide for the orderly conduct of Martin County Fair events and to establish minimum acceptable requirements for such events. These rules shall govern the condition of all events and by participating in these events, all exhibitors are deemed to have complied with these rules. No express or implied warranty of safety shall result from publications of, or compliance with, these rules and/or regulations. They are intended as a guide for the conduct of the fair.
- Entries and reservations for pens or ties for Open Class Swine, Cattle and Sheep must be made with the Office by August 11, 2025, except in shows where otherwise stated.
- Entry tags will be furnished to exhibitors in every department specifying Department, Class, Lot and Exhibitor's Number. These tags should be attached to exhibit so that superintendent and judge can identify exhibit.
- The Martin County Fair will provide proper policing for both day and night, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage to articles or animals.
- 5. All exhibits must remain in place until released by Department Superintendent. Premiums will be withheld if this rule is violated.
- 6. Changes in entries will not be accepted after being posted in judge's book, without superintendent's permission.
- 7. No person will be permitted to interfere with committees or judges while they are performing their duties as clerks or judges.
- 8. The Martin County Fair Board of Directors shall have the final ruling on all questions and be in control to settle any disputes or differences of opinion.
- 9. Competent judges are selected by the Fair. Any protests must be made in writing, accompanied by a deposit fee of \$50.00 and filed with the Secretary before the end of the Fair. All appeals and protests will be settled by the Fair Board at a future meeting when all parties are asked to appear.
- 10. No award will be considered declared until the judge's books have been properly signed by the judge and returned to the Fair Office.
- 11. Premiums will be paid in full if sufficient funds are available to meet the demands; if not, premiums will be prorated according to money available. No premium will be paid unless listed in the current premium book. Premiums will be paid as soon as records are completed after the Fair. Premium checks not cashed by Sept. 30, 2025 will become void and declared as a donation to the Fair.
- 12. All premium check errors must be reported by the Monday after the fair.
- 13. Merchants and manufacturers are invited to display goods handled by them. Several locations on the grounds are designed for their displays. All displays should be manned by owner or their employee.
- 14. Restrooms are provided at the industrial building, cattle barn, multi-use building and in the concession building next to the grandstand.
- 15. Industrial building exhibits will be open at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Sunday from 12:00 p.m. 6:00 p.m. and will close at 9:00 p.m. except Saturday when it opens at 10:00 am.
- 16.Commercial exhibits will be released at 7:00 p.m. Sunday, August 17.
- 17. Kietzer Arena must be vacated by 7:00 p.m. when races are scheduled.
- 18. No dogs allowed on grounds unless Service Dog.
- 19. No bikes, skateboards or scooters allowed on grounds.

MINNESOTA STATE LIVESTOCK SANITARY REGULATIONS

Exhibitors must obey Rules and Regulations Governing Public Exhibition of Livestock and Poultry in Minnesota as adopted and approved by the Attorney General. For information on these rules and regulations, see the exhibit superintendent or your local veterinarian.

LIVESTOCK ENTRY RULES AND REGULATIONS

By signing and filling out an entry form, you agree to abide by the rules and regulations set forth, and release the Martin County Fair from any liability arising from your exhibit and participation in the Martin County Fair.

- 1. All livestock entries, complete with entry fee, must be sent to the Fair Office, P.O. Box 270, no later than August 11, 2025, except in shows where otherwise stated.
- 2. All livestock entered for exhibit must be owned by the exhibitor.
- 3. Entries of purebred animals over one year of age must include name and registry number of animal. On entries of purebred animals under one year of age, name and registry number of sire and dam must be stated on entry blank.
- 4. When there are fewer animals shown in a lot than number of premiums offered, the judges may, at their discretion, award a premium as the animal deserves.
- 5. Certificates of Registration or proof of breeding must be furnished to the exhibit division superintendents upon demand.
- 6. Exhibitors must keep the space in the rear of the assigned stalls and alleyways of the barns clear and clean. All litter must be thrown in areas as directed by exhibit superintendent. The Fair Board reserves the right to withhold premiums for those who fail to abide by this rule.
- When removing animals at the close of the Fair, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to clean his stalls.
- 8. All livestock exhibitors will be responsible for supplying their own feed, hay and bedding except as outlined in the rules.
- 9. For specific information on livestock exhibits, please refer to the department information elsewhere in this premium book.
- 10. If any livestock exhibitor has proof that he has to attend another show, see the superintendent for release permission.

BEDDING FOR LIVESTOCK

Beef: The use of wood shavings is mandatory. The wood shavings will be provided at \$10.00 per tie and will be placed in each cattle stall on entry day. You will be charged at check-in.

Poultry & Rabbit: Bedding fee of \$1.50 per pen payable on day of entry.

Swine: First bedding is free courtesy of the Martin County Pork Producers. Additional bedding is available by contacting Dean Weiss at Weiss Milling.

Horses: Wood shavings will be available from Weiss Milling located in the Floyd Bellin/Agriculture Education Building.

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
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



SUNDAY RANCH RIDING CLASSES: JUNIOR & SENIOR RANCH PLEASURE AND JUNIOR & SENIOR RANCH RIDING

Horses may not be shown in this class with fake tails, banded or cropped manes, hoof black. Tack & Clothing should be void of silver and adornment, long sleeved collared shirt, jeans, western hat or helmet and boots.

Chaps and spurs optional.

ABOUT THE RANCH RIDING CLASS: AQHA Introduced Ranch Riding classes with the purpose of the class to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasurable ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse in this class should reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working ranch horse, simulating riding typically conducted outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, released, guiet, soft, and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without requiring undue restraint, but not shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manner and responsiveness of the ranch riding horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as well as quality of the movement are of primary considerations. The ideal ranch riding hour should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver.

ABOUT THE RANCH PLEASURE CLASS: Ranch Horse Pleasure is judged as a rail class that is designed to show the athletic ability of the ranch type horse without having the suitable footing for reining. Judging will be based on the walk, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope, spin left or right, side pass, stop and back at the digression of the judge. Credit should be given to smoothness finesse, attitude, quickness, and authority in performing the maneuvers when asked. Ranch pleasure horses will be judged on a forward movement and carry a natural head carriage.
